| Reading | 5 reading passages ( $700-750$ words), 65 minutes: <br> - 4 regular passages <br> - 1 paired passage <br> - 52 questions <br> Content: <br> - US \& world literature <br> - History \& social studies <br> - Science <br> Includes informational graphics | 4 reading passages (700-900 words), 35 minutes: <br> - 3 regular passages <br> - 1 paired passage <br> - 40 questions <br> Content (always in this sequence): <br> - Prose fiction <br> - Social science <br> - Humanities <br> - Natural Science |
|  | SAT Reading emphasizes vocabulary in context more than ACT Reading. At least one SAT passage is more challenging than all of the ACT passages. <br> SAT tests ability to draw inferences/conclusions from evidence; ACT tests speed \& instant recall. |  |
| Writing/ English | Revise \& correct errors in 4 writing passages, 35 minutes -44 questions: <br> - Grammar \& usage <br> - Punctuation <br> - Structure <br> - Rhetoric <br> Includes informational graphics | Revise \& correct errors in 5 writing passages, 45 minutes - 75 questions: <br> - Grammar and usage <br> - Punctuation <br> - Structure <br> - Rhetoric |
|  | SAT Writing emphasizes vocabulary in context more than ACT Writing. SAT Writing questions $>50 \%$ rhetoric; ACT Writing questions $<50 \%$ rhetoric. <br> SAT Writing passages tend to require a higher level of reading than ACT English passages. |  |

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| Math | Content (Algebra is King!): <br> - Algebra 1 \& 2 <br> - Geometry (<10\%) <br> - Trigonometry <br> - Problem-Solving \& Data Analysis <br> - Statistics, Probability <br> - Emphasis on word problems \& questions in real-world context <br> Structure: <br> - 80 minutes <br> - 45 multiple-choice questions <br> - 13 grid-in questions <br> - Math formulas provided (at start of each section) <br> - $1^{\text {st }}$ section: no calculator ( $34 \%$ of all math questions) <br> - $2^{\text {nd }}$ section: calculator OK | Content: <br> - Pre-Algebra <br> - Algebra 1 \& 2 <br> - Geometry (~25\%) <br> - Statistics, Probability <br> - Trigonometry <br> Structure: <br> - 60 minutes <br> - 60 multiple-choice questions <br> - No math formulas provided <br> - Calculator allowed on all questions <br> - Questions more straight-forward than SAT |
|  | SAT: almost $2 / 3$ algebra, limited geometry; ACT: more evenly balanced algebra \& geometry. <br> SAT Math questions often require multi-step, multi-concept problem-solving. <br> ACT Math questions generally involve straightforward application of a single math concept. |  |
| Essay | Optional essay discontinued in Spring of 2021 | - Optional <br> - 40 minutes <br> - Read a background paragraph on a complex issue, analyze and evaluate 3 perspectives, create your own perspective |
| Science | No separate science section <br> Science infused in all sections of the test and reported as a separate "cross-test score" | Tests reasoning more than knowledge, and the ability to interpret tables, graphs, and charts in the context of topics from these fields: <br> - Biology <br> - Physics <br> - Chemistry <br> - Earth/Space Science <br> Structure: <br> - 6 passages <br> - 40 questions <br> - 35 minutes |
