A I-on-I education at Score Academy means that your child will learn in a traditional teacher-student classroom setting with ONE MAJOR EXCEPTION: he or she will be the only student in the classroom with the teacher! Our Small Classroom Advantage program, traditionally with 2-7 students in a classroom, provides that same individualized, nurturing educational experience for students.

Score Academy is part of Score At The Top Learning Center, a family-owned group of full-service, comprehensive learning centers offering motivational tutoring in all academic subjects; SAT, ACT, and FCAT preparation with proven score gains; specialized support services for student with learning disabilities or attention deficit disorder; and individualized college counseling by Judi Robinovitz, Certified Educational Planner.

To date, **100**% of the students who have earned their high-school diploma at Score Academy have successfully continued their education in college, most to 4-year colleges, and some with a Florida Bright Futures Scholarship.

PRIVATE SCHOOLING WITH SCORE ACADEMY — HOW DOES IT WORK?

The Head of School will work with you to determine your child's educational needs and then design an academic program, select the best teachers, and establish a schedule to match those unique needs.

A typical full-time student takes 4-5 core academic courses and up to 2 electives each semester. The student will attend I-on-I or small-group classes for approximately 20 hours/week, usually Monday through Friday.

We also create special programs for part-time students, such as a plan that combines independent study with scheduled class time (great for motivated, high-achieving students) or one which allows students to take some classes at Score Academy and other classes in a traditional school, through dual-enrollment, or on their own. Some students need a teacher for core curriculum classes but only need supervision for electives.

Score Academy can also incorporate Florida Virtual School for some or all classes, so that a Score Academy teacher successfully mentors the student through the curriculum. With this academic arrangement, fewer contact hours may be needed.



Like any other school, we give students homework, research assignments, scheduled tests, and quizzes. However, the amount of work is tailored to each student's specific needs and academic goals.

A TYPICAL SCHOOL DAY AT SCORE ACADEMY



The school day can start as early or as late as necessary, based on the time of day when your child learns best, and taking outside activities into consideration. Some students have a short study hall following each class, while other students attend classes consecutively with short breaks between classes in order to be

released earlier. Some students prefer one daily study hall to reduce homework time at home.

WHEN CAN MY CHILD START SCHOOL AT SCORE ACADEMY?



We register students on a rolling basis throughout the year. In fact, it's not unusual to meet with a parent on one day and start the student in classes a day or two later. Recognizing the importance of continuity of education, we set up a schedule to get the student going as soon as possible.

Score Academy is guided by the Florida Sunshine State Standards and the Common Core for Mathematics and English when designing a student's individualized curriculum. The Head of School matches the curriculum to each student's specific learning style and personal goals. Because one curriculum does not fit all students, we will recommend the best one to fulfill your educational plan. We offer

courses in all subject areas across all grade levels, from kindergarten through 12th grade, and at all educational levels, from remedial and on-level to honors and Advanced Placement. Our AP curriculum and teaching staff have been certified by the College Board. The NCAA has approved all Score Academy core courses for use in establishing the initial eligibility certification status of student athletes.

PROGRESS REPORTS, REPORT CARDS, AND TEACHER MEETINGS

After each class, your child's teacher will prepare a session recap that will be reviewed by the Head of School and then emailed to you. The recap will contain a summary of the material covered, the student's level of understanding, the homework grade from the previous day and the next homework assignment, as well as a rating of the student's energy, preparation, and progress.

Score Academy issues report cards on a quarterly basis and an official transcript at the end of each school year. Teacher conferences are conducted once during each semester, and the Head of School is available at any time to discuss your child's progress, curriculum, teachers, and schedule. We can administer the Stanford Achievement Test on an annual basis to measure students' academic progress and pinpoint areas for improvement or acceleration.

OUR TEACHERS

COLLEGE COUNSELING

Our founding owner, Certified Educational Planner Judi Robinovitz,, and our staff provide expert college counseling services to our full-time enrolled juniors and seniors:

- o Judi leads a college-planning seminar for all seniors and their parents about the college application process, including the responsibilities of the student, parent, and Score Academy staff.
- o Judi meets with each senior and his or her parents to create a college list at the beginning of first semester.
- o Seniors work on essays with their English teacher as part of the English curriculum.
- o Seniors may ask one or two current teachers to write and send recommendations to the colleges to which they are applying.
- o Judi meets with each senior and his or her family one more time to discuss their final college list after the student has narrowed the list, making sure the list is appropriate and balanced.
- o A designated teacher reviews and approves each senior's online college applications before the student submits them.
- o The School Director writes a school recommendation for each senior and sends it with the student's official transcript and Score Academy profile to each college to which the student is applying.

Juniors:

- o Mid-way through the junior year, Judi leads a college-planning seminar for all juniors and their parents about the college planning process, including an SAT/ACT testing calendar.
- o Judi meets with each junior and his or her parents to create a preliminary college list at the beginning of second semester.
- o Each junior's English teacher begins work on the personal statement at the end of the junior year.







REQUIREMENTS FOR HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION

To earn a college-prep diploma from Score Academy, a student must successfully complete the following course requirements:

- English: 4 years
- Mathematics: 4 years (Algebra I & 2; Geometry; one more advanced year-long course)
- Science: 3 years (including biology with laboratory)
- Social Science: 3 years (World History, US History, Government/Economics)
- Foreign Language: 2 years (same language)
- PE/Health: I yearComputers: I year
- Arts: I year

The above requirements are the minimum required for graduation. However, most 4-year colleges tend to require at least three additional years of core electives.

A student who is unable to complete two years of the same foreign language or four years of mathematics may elect to instead receive a general diploma. However, for students with learning disabilities which contra-indicate these foreign language or mathematics requirements, alternative course requirements may be substituted, such as a foreign cultures course or practical mathematics.

In order to receive a diploma from Score Academy, a student must be enrolled in at least three senior-year courses for credit at Score Academy with the remainder of the course credits earned through dual-enrollment in a local college (e.g., PBSC) or through a regionally accredited distance-education provider (e.g., flvs).







POLICIES ON REPEATING A COURSE, TRANSFER OF CREDITS, and GRADING RUBRIC

Repeating a Course

If a Score Academy student receives an F on a course required for graduation, the student must repeat the course to remain on a diploma track. Both grades may appear on the transcript and the second attempt will be noted. A Score Academy student may also elect to repeat a course in which he or she previously earned a D. The same transcript policies apply. Credit toward the high school diploma is given for only one attempt at the course.

Transfer

If a student transfers into Score Academy from another school, we will accept all previous coursework from other regionally accredited high schools. However, courses required for graduation in which a student received an F must be repeated. Both grades may appear on the transcript and the second attempt will be noted. A student may also to elect to repeat a course in which he or she previously earned a D. The same transcript policies apply. Credit toward the high school diploma is given for only one attempt at the course.

At least 2 years of the same foreign language may be taken in any two consecutive years of high school

The three I-year electives in the arts, PE/health, and computers may be taken in any order.

Other Options:

- Honors and AP courses are available in all academic disciplines.
- Students with a diagnosed learning disability in math may take a 2-year sequence in Algebra I, a Geometry course without proofs, and a less intensive Algebra 2 course
- Students with a disability that contra-indicates taking a foreign language may substitute appropriate social science or other core courses
- A core academic subject may be substituted for the I-year computer requirement.
- Other course substitutions may be possible under special circumstances.
